Library of The Chathams Rules of Conduct

Library of The Chathams is responsible for maintaining a welcoming, open atmosphere as well as a quiet, comfortable, and orderly environment. The *Library Rules of Conduct* are made to ensure such an environment, so people can use the facilities and collections to the optimum extent possible.

The following activities are not allowed in the Library:

- 1. Eating or drinking except in the Gallery.
- 2. Talking on cell phones except in the Gallery.
- 3. Carrying a weapon into the Library.
- 4. Misusing the library building (i.e., using The Library restrooms as a laundry or washing facility).
- 5. Leaving a child under the age of ten years unattended in the building.
- 6. Talking loudly, making noise, playing audio equipment or engaging in other disruptive activity.
- 7. Interfering with another person's use of The Library or with the Library personnel's performance of their duties.
- 8. Bodily hygiene that is so offensive that it interferes with another person's use of the Library or with the Library personnel's performance of their duties.
- 9. Abusive language to Library staff or other patrons.
- 10. Engaging in sexual conduct, including but not limited to public indecency, viewing obscene material, or offensive touching.
- 11. Threatening or physically harming Library staff or patrons.
- 12. Leaving belongings unattended.
- 13. Physical obstruction of aisles, stairs, elevator, or traffic corridors.
- 14. Failure to wear upper body clothing, lower body clothing, or shoes.
- 15. Wearing of wet bathing suits.
- 16. Bringing animals into the Library except those needed to assist with a disability.
- 17. Solicitation of contributions or signatures.
- 18. Conducting of surveys without the permission of the Library Director.

Violators will be subject to the following penalties:

- 1. For first infractions, violators will be asked to stop such actions. If they do not desist, they will be required to leave The Library for the remainder of the day.
- 2. For repeat offenses, the Library Director or designee may with-draw library privileges for up to 30 days.
- 3. On a case-by-case basis because of the serious or repeated nature of the offense, the Library Director may extend the loss of library privileges to 90 days.
