

Bestselling Authors to Present a Series of Virtual Talks



The Henna Artist on Thursday, July 7 at 9:00 PM EDT.


The author wrote her debut novel at age 62 and will share inspirations for her work and how her mother's life story has influenced her writing.



The Global Displacement Crisis

One percent of the world population is currently displaced, a number that has doubled since 2010. Out of 79.5 million total



forcibly displaced persons in the world in 2019, 45.7 million were internally displaced persons (IDPs), i.e. those who left their homes but never crossed a national border. Tom O'Mealia, Post-Doctoral Research Fellow at Harvard University, will discuss what is driving this increase in displacement and what are the consequences for communities who host refugees or IDPs.
