#### **Our Library Catalog**



When using the Main Library Alliance catalog at <a href="https://chatham.aspendiscovery.org/">https://chatham.aspendiscovery.org/</a>, an orange button in the lower left corner of the page gives access to **ReachDeck**, a new tool that enlarges text size and allows text to be read aloud. There is a link to settings so that the searching experience can be individualized. Please ask a librarian if you need assistance when learning to use **ReachDeck**.

# The New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center (TBBC)



TBBC provides no-cost, home-delivered services to children, teens and adults in New Jersey whose ability to read is affected by a physical impairment, a reading

disability, or vision impairment. The collection includes books in Braille, large type, and audio. Also available is a service called Newsline that offers access to national and international newspapers, breaking news sources, magazines, weather forecasts, and more, accessible via touchtone phone, mobile apps, email, and on the Web. (Machines for playing recorded materials are available on loan from TBBC.)

Also available through TBBC is an app for Apple and Android devices called **BARD Mobile**.

To join the program, each new reader must complete an application and have it certified for eligibility.

### **Library Equal Access Program (LEAP)**



LEAP offers speech and magnification assistive technology training to consumers age 55 and over.

Training is offered in basic and intermediate computer and iPad skills. Classes are held at 9 different libraries
