A part of the community since 1907 and a joint library since 1975, we strive to be the intellectual and social center of Chatham Borough and Chatham Township.

More than a place for books, we provide resources that support valuable opportunities to build knowledge, culture, and social experiences that enrich lives.

Library of the Chathams is part of the Main Library Alliance that includes over 50 public libraries in Hunterdon, Morris, Somerset, Union, and Warren counties. We are also part of the Morris-Union Federation and Open Borrowing, giving you in-person borrowing privileges at over 100 public libraries in Northern and Central New Jersey.

Joining the Library



Residents or taxpayers of Chatham Borough and Chatham Township, ages 5 and up, may register for a free library card in person or online. Proof of residency in the form of a New Jersey

Driver's License, checkbook, lease or mortgage agreement, rent or tax receipt, or a utility bill in applicant's name is required to register. Students at Chatham Middle School and Chatham High School may use their student ID to register. Out-of-county residents who are teachers or students in Chatham schools may be eligible to register for a full service library card. Out-of-county residents who are employed in the Chathams can apply for a courtesy card.

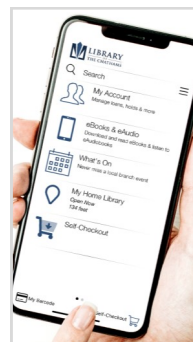
Get Connected
